and personal Estate in four
equal Shares and my Wife Mary
Rawson, - have the management
and Control of my Farm while
it remains in the hands of the
said Legatee - and while she the
said Mary Rawson remains my
Widow in the event of her the
said Mary Rawson marrying
again then and in such case I order
the Land and Stock to be sold and
two hundred pounds Sterling to
be given said Mary Rawson the
balance to be equally divided between
the ^{other} three persons herein named
and I hereby appoint Mary Rawson
my Wife and Charles Astor of Waltham
Executors of this my Will In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand this
twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one
Thousand eight hundred and ninety
Signed by the said George Rawson
the Testator and by him declared
to be his last will and Testament
in the presence of us present at the same
time who in his presence at his
request and in the presence of each of us
have hereunto subscribed our names
as Witnesses William Howard
